Dogs with long noses have an increased risk for **nose cancer**.

Birds are at a higher risk of lung cancer and may experience eyesight problems.



Bunnies have an increased risk of **lung disease** and **heart problems**.



Secondhand smoke contains thousands of **chemicals**, at least 70 are **known to cause cancer**.
